

Greetings:

Most people I talk to agree that God is moving quickly in many areas of their lives and I am of no exception to this. God is truly blessing the Flagging Ministry in abundance and it seems to me, that we worship a God who loves worship so why wouldn't He bless all of His Ministries whose hearts are to worship Him?

With the constant busyness which some of us are facing on a regular basis, it is important for us to always take the time we need, to be continually re-fuelled so we can then continue on with what God has called us to do. This seems to be what Jacob did. The Bible says, *"Then he dreamed, and behold, a ladder was set up on the earth, and its top reached to heaven; and there the angels of God were ascending and descending on it."* (Gen 28:12). This was really a visitation from God.

In this visitation, God revealed to Jacob that He is the Lord of the past, the present and the future. This brought Jacob into a relationship with the Lord. This caused him to have faith that he could actually grab hold of the promise and blessing that had been spoken over him. This also gave him confidence that he could have a relationship, with Holy God, just as his father and grandfather (Isaac and Abraham) had.

From this experience, Jacob began to worship God personally in the following ways:

1. He acknowledged that the Lord had been in the place with him, even though before that point he could not see Him.
2. He memorialized the place, set up a stone and poured oil on it.
3. He renamed the place Bethel, the House of God.

4. He recognized God as provider.
5. He had a desire to give a portion of what he had back to the Lord.
6. The fear of God began to be a part of his life.
7. He declared that a “Gate of Heaven” had opened forever in that place.

In “Worship God” Ernest Gentile writes:

The sudden appearance of the heavenly ladder must have seemed to Jacob to be God’s invitation to come up into His presence. The transcendent God created a direct way to meet with lowly man. With the ladder, God initiated worship. He made a way for men to come before God. Then, Jacob saw angels model the responsive action of a worshiper. The Bible speaks of the angels ascending first and then descending. Symbolically, the angels showed what must take place in people’s lives if they are to be true, successful servants of the Lord. First, having “seen” the heavenly invitation, they ascend the shining staircase through their worship. Then, after being in the presence of God, they descend the ladder back to Earth to perform acts of service. First they go up to meet with God, then, they can go down to the world with ministry of service.

This is in all forms of how, we today, need to be led in whatever God has called us to do. Our first and foremost goal must be to *seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness*, (Matt 6:33). The Word of God then continues on to say in that same scripture...*and all these things shall be added to you*. What are all these things that shall be added to you? They are a promise from God that He will take care of all the “who”, “what”, “where”, “when” and “why’s” in your life and in your Ministry.

I have learned, no matter what chaos I have to deal with in my life, as long as I pursue God first through soaking, prayer and worship, He will take care of everything else. It is imperative, if we are truly ones who “surrender all” to God,

then everything we are and everything we have actually belong to God and not ourselves, therefore, we must always pursue Him first and trust God to take care of the rest. This surrender then becomes a beautiful portrait of pure worship unto our Lord, Jesus Christ, as His divine presence is then released in our lives.

Chuck Pierce writes:

The awareness of divine presence, however symbolized and realized, is absolutely essential to worship. Like Jacob, every true worshiper becomes aware that “the Lord is in this place!” As in the case of Jacob, the sense of presence may come in private and personal experience. However, the basic pattern could be found in the promise of Jesus, according to Matthew 18:20 – *For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.*” The heart of Christian worship is the power of Christ’s presence (see John 14:12-14; Acts 2:43-47; Acts 4:9-12, 32-37; 1 Cor 5:3-4; Rev 2:1).

In conclusion, I believe as we “surrender all” by pursuing God first, and then worship God with our flagging in this complete place of surrender, the heart of Christian worship is then released, which releases the power of Christ’s presence in a gathered community of disciples.
